"The Creator does not abandon us; he never forsakes his loving plan or repents of having created us." Laudato Si' (13)

In the book of Genesis, after the flood, God establishes a covenant with Noah and every living creature. "I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and Earth. When I bring clouds over Earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living things, so that the water shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings." Genesis 9:13-16
